The County Final versus Mountbellew-Moylough has been fixed for Tuam Stadium at 4.00 pm on Sunday 15 October.

Forty years ago this year, in 1977, Corofin won only their third County Football Championship, having had previous victories in 1932 and 1946. Corofin defeated Moycullen in the final on a scoreline of 1-9 to 0-3. The team was captained by Maurice Burke, who passed to Jimmy Duggan in the ninth minute of the first half for him to score the game's only goal. The team also featured Gerry and Ollie Burke who both went on to win All-Ireland Club titles with Corofin some 21 years later in 1998.
